Morris so close to **1000** runs

Hugh Morris is poised to become the first England qualified player to win the race to 1,000 runs since Chris Smith in 1985.

The Glamorgan opener is 90 runs short of the tagic four figure mark and will be hoping to reach the target in the three day Britannic Assurance hampionship match against Middlesex at Cardiff, which starts tomorrow

Closest to the man who currently tops the national averages with 82.72 is Smith himself. The Hampshire and England batsman, who launched his career at Glamorgan, is 38 runs behind Morris, with Essey's Salim Malik next in line another 30 runs

In the last 11 seasons, only three England qualified players have won the race to 1,000 runs -current Test captain Graham Gooch in 1980, Mike Gatting in 1982 and Smith in 1985.

Morris will also be eyeing another landmark as he attempts to break the Glamorgan record for the quickest 1,000 runs for the county in a season.

That record is held by former Test player Gilbert Parkhouse, who reached four figures on June 17 in both 1950 and 1959.

As far as Glamorgan are concerned, Morris needs to score 134 more runs by Monday to match Parkhouse as 44 of his first-class tally to date this summer came when he led MCC against Middlesex

If he could get those runs in one innings, he would also match the record of Majid Khan of reaching his 1,000 for the county in 15 innings.

Morris is well ahead of his record breaking sedule of last year when he had to wait until July 24, and his 26th first-class innings, to reach 1,000. After that, he flourished and went on to amass a county record 2,276 runs.

By admitting last night that he is still not fully fit—despite producing a man-of-the-match performance in the Benson and Hedges Cup semi-final at Chelmsford—Botham ruled himself out of next Thursday's second Test.

With the 35-year-old all-rounder no longer a contender for Lord's, England seem certain to name an unchanged squad, a fitting enough reward following the historic victory over the West Indies.

Manager Micky Stewart must have been impressed yesterday as Botham ended any hope of an Essex fightback by exploiting helpful conditions to capture three wickets for just 11 runs from 11 overs


