Malik went on to record his sixth century of the season in 13 fours and faced 251 deliveries in reaching three figures and was a model of concentration through-

Fidler was furious that Albion failed to make the most of an inspired spell of early pressure — and then handed VS the points with "an absolute gift of a goal."




