Derbyshire's championship season has been blighted by inadequate first innings batting performances.

Sometimes the pitch has favoured the bowling side, sometimes it has been that Derbyshire have batted badly, yesterday it was a combination of the two.

Yes, the pitch was well grassed and greenish in colour. Yes, it was a good toss to win. Yes, Derbyshire were without Kim Barnett and Frank Griffith to bolster the batting.

Yes, Somerset do have bowlers in Andrew Caddick and Neil Mallerender, who are able to take advantage of

conditions in their favour.

Having said that, 135 all out in 38 overs is an inadequate performance and Somerset's reply of 79-0 in 26 overs by close of play puts the matter into perspective. Now Derbyshire have a great deal to do to remain in this match.

The morning conditions at the County Ground were horrible. Never the most hospitable of grounds when the winds blows, it really howled across the open spaces as rain lashed the terraces. In all, 43 overs of play vanished to the elements.

Later, the weather relented and evening sunlight reminded supporters that cricket is really a summer game.

Peter Bowler is not having a good run at present. Too often he is getting out in the 20s and 30s and is not the rock on which many Derbyshire innings were based last season.

This time he was out for nought in the first over of the day. That set the pattern and only a determined 50 by Chris Adams and a quickfire 30 off 25 balls, by Matthew Vandura, held up Caddick and Mallerender, who each finished with 5-49.

Even more worrying for prospects in this match was that Derbyshire looked less and less likely of getting a Somerset wicket.

# Minor miracle on Test road

Derbyshire's visit to Durham last week, though disappointing in terms of results, was at least stimulating in terms of the professional progress made by the home county (writes IAN HALL).

Many people have been doubtful of Durham's capacity to become a first-class cricket county.

The gulf between minor counties cricket and the first-class game is immense, not just on the playing side but in the whole scale of running a county club.

Durham will succeed — of that there is no doubt.

The enthusiasm for cricket in the North-East is tremendous and the desire to make Durham a truly first-class county is intense, not only in Durham itself but also in Tyndeside, Teeside, Northumberland and even North Yorkshire. With strong backing from industry in the area, money seems to be no problem.

How long it will take to make Durham a

power in the land is more difficult to assess.

Playing at the moment on a variety of grounds in the north-east, the club is able to have a close identification with supporters and vice-versa.

The membership is so high that at many venues ballots have to be held for tickets for Sunday League fixtures.

The new headquarters ground at Chester-le-Street is due for completion in 1996. The ultimate aim is to challenge Headingley for Test match cricket in the future.

Glamorgan were the last county to achieve first-class status, in 1921. Until 1939 they only ever achieved two single figure championship placements (seventh and eighth). Now Durham must match enthusiasm with success.

● Derbyshire's Sunday League performance in a 112-run defeat was dreadful — and the players knew it — while rain washed out much of the championship fixture. A draw

was always likely and Derbyshire did not fool around with 'declaration' bowling.

Without Kim Barnett, Dominic Cork, Alan Warner, Devon Malcolm and Frank Griffith, who suffered a torn hamstring in the match, Derbyshire's resources were stretched, but Ole Mortensen rose to the occasion with 5-55.

Now opportunities are knocking for the youngsters with Adrian Rollins, particularly, looking the part.

His 85 runs in the match, including 50 in only his third championship innings, followed his 48 unbeaten runs at Kidderminster. He looks to have a good technique and, most importantly, a sound temperament.

Gary Steer's second ball 'duck' in his first innings' debut was enough to unnerve anyone, but 37 not out in the second innings was a good effort.

Now Derbyshire's priority must be to discover some more bowlers.
