PAKISTAN Test ace Rashid Latif led a runs-in-the-sun slaughter of leaders BARTON as MARCHINGTON swept to the top of Burton **Tiles Premier Division.**

And in another clash that produced mammoth scores, Draycott & Hanbury's Adam Hall and Mick McGuinness of Ind Coope joined Latif on the centurions roll of honour.

Barton hardly knew what had hit them after the most promising of starts at Jacks Lane.

After removing both openers cheaply the team that began the day as league leaders were put to the sword as Latif piled up 137, sharing a major partnership with Wasim Rouff.

And, to rub salt into a gaping wound, former Burton teman Graham Chamberlain also showed his prowess with the bat.

The Marchington No 5 clubbed 40 off 15 balls, including 28 off the last over made up of 2 sixes and 4 fours.

Marchington closed their innings on a daunting 283-3 and though Barton stuck gamely to their task they failed to go even close to a bonus point.

Chamberlain bowled a 17-over stint to claim 6-47 as the visitors struggled to 167 all out.

IND COOPE'S Belvedere Park ground proved to be a batsman's paradise as bowlers toiled long and hard for little or no reward.

DRAYCOTT & HANBURY made the most of the conditions after winning the toss, with Mark Smedley and Paul Walker's 53-run opening partnership laying the foundation for a middle order assault.

Owen Birch's quickfire 79 was made in typical Barba-dian style and Derbyshire youth player Adam Hall fin-ished with a six to complete a deserved century.

The home team could not match the scoring rate until, too late in the game, McGuinness and Jon Fryatt cut loose in entertaining style to earn their team two bonus points.

UTTOXETER continued to show encouraging form their return to the top flight and saw off BURTON by runs at the racecourse.


Ian Hodgson was the mainstay of the Uttoxeter innings with a fine half century in a total of 171-6.
