## Dunstall do the business

DUNSTALL were worthy winners of their mid-table clash with Morton. The home side managed 159 for five in difficult conditions and bowled the visitors out with Martin Clewley and Steve Scrimshaw taking three wickets each.

Dunstall openers David Firth and James Benstead provided the home side with a solid start putting on 43 for the first wicket in only 14 overs, before Firth was dismissed for 20. A combination of drying conditions and accurate bowling from Andy Elks and Ian Bowler restricted Dunstall's scoring, with Martin Hall, James Benstead and Ian Graves all falling in quick succession to leave the home side struggling on 69 for four.

Ian Bourke and Danny Spasic briefly picked up the pace before Bourke was bowled by Elks for 14 to leave Dunstall on 89 for five with only eight overs remaining. New batsmen Rob Cooper then joined Spasic in an important partnership for the home side. The sixth wicket pair plundered 70 runs in the remaining overs to leave the home side on 159 for five, with Spasic finishing on 47 not out and Cooper 22 not out.

Morton's reply began in steady fashion with Nigel Elks and Steve Jelly putting on 45 runs for the first wicket in 18 overs to leave their side well placed to bat to victory. New bat Mark Lindley joined Jelly but the pair suddenly found runs very difficult against a Dunstall side intent on making their visitors work hard for victory.

Lindley and Jelly took the score to 58 for one off 26 overs, before the home side gained reward for their efforts in the field. With the scoring rate moving up to five runs an over, Jelly tried to force Spasic to the boundary, but only succeeded in skying the ball to the hands of Dave Firth.

Continued pressure brought reward when Dunstall skipper Martin Clewley trapped Andy Elks lbw for 0. Elks was quickly followed back to the pavilion by Doug Whitmore following a run out and Andy Clark who was stumped by Ed Taylor off Clewley for 0. Spasic completed a miserable eight overs for the visitors which had seen five wickets fall for only four runs, when Martin Hall caught Lindley to leave the visitors 62 for six.

Sensing victory Dunstall went on the attack, with Clewley soon picking up a third wicket when Bowler was caught behind. With overs running out Clewley called Scrimshaw back into the attack, and he immediately repaid his captain's faith by first removing Lowe, and then in the last over forcing Jelly into an error to leave the home players celebrating victory.

● DUNSTALL's second string avenged last year's defeat at Matlock and continued their strong start to the season. The hosts never looked comfortable against Dunstall's opening attack of Matt Benstead and Tom Suggate and then struggled with economical support bowling from Rod Easter (4-41).

Dunstall made short work of their target with their reply dominated by a 65-run third wicket partnership from Rob Dytham and free-scoring Geoff Holliday (42 in 30 balls).

## Leaders come a cropper

HOPWAS came down to earth with a bump as KINGS BROMLEY inflicted their first defeat in 22 games.

Home team Bromley could muster only 106 against the bowling of Phil Rainsford (6-39), but Hopwas were shot out for 92 as Mark Crossland and Richard Lightwood shared the bowling honours.

Second-placed TUTBURY 2ND made ground on the leaders thanks to a comfortable win over bottom team TRENTSIDE 2ND.

Matt Seabourn returned figures of 5-36 as Trentside were restricted to 142 and Tutbury lost only four wickets in reaching their

LULLINGTON Park powered to a 70-run victory over Premier Division One side Langley Mill to cause a major upset in the Derbyshire County League's Silverlink Trophy.

The win followed on from Park taking a rich points haul in a bore-draw at home to Duffield in Premier Division Two.

Mervyn Timbrell, opening with Kiwi Garth Littlejohn, completed a half century, before going on to a catch by keeper Hadfield, while his partner made 65 before being run-out, as was skipper David Mudd on 17.

Howard Dytham struck an unbeaten 38 while Ryan Hetherington made 20 not out in even time to power Park to 208-3.

Mudd claimed the scalps of both Duffield openers Johnson and Mills as Steve Docker and Matt Sadler also picked up wickets.

Spinner Littlejohn conceded only 11 runs in a 15-over stint, to raise Park's hopes but their Derby opponents reached 72-7 in 46 overs.

Littlejohn with 46 and Timbrell, again making a half century before being

trapped leg before for 55 made a splendid opening stand on Sunday.

Tony Mudd put up middle order resistance, sharing a stand with John Goodwin that swung the game back Park's Way.

Goodwin went to Pierrepont for 23, while Mudd ended with an unbeaten half century, with his side on 211-7.

Docker and Dave Mudd made early inroads into the batting but Stubbings halted their progress with 41 before Pierrepont lofted four sixes off Littlejohn, in a rapid-fire 28, before the spinner took revenge.

The Kiwi completed his all-round day with a four-wicket haul and with Jonny Shales and Paul Webb also grabbing wickets, Langley Mill were bowled out for 141 - Park going through to the quarter finals with a 70-run margin.

● PARK's seconds drew at Rolls Royce in Division 4A making 212-6, with Dale Clark on 64, skipper Alistair Chapman on 48, with an unbeaten 33 from Danny Green and 21 from Tom Chapman.

Seamer Colin Shaw (2-29) and spinner Richard Allsopp collected three wickets but the home side finished on 184-6.

Park marched into the quarter finals of the divisional cup with father and son Pete

and Danny Green in the runs, 48 and 38 respectively, which with 20 from Ted Shaw boosted them to 172-8. Hatton were dismissed for 140.

● PARK's thirds won by 181 runs against Nutbrook. Acting skipper Dave Bridgen hit 52, Dave Smith smashed 76 and there was a half century from Steve Gough as Park romped to 251-4.

Nutbrook were out for 70 as teenager Will Chapman, with 3-2, John Oldfield 4-30, Ian Shaw and Gil Oldfield led the attack.
