## Tennis

GREG Rusedski has held on to his number four world ranking despite bowing out of the Stella Artois tournament last week with an injured ankle while Tim Henman has moved up one place from 18 to 17.

This means that both British players will be among the Wimbledon seeds, although there is considerable doubt about Rusedski's fitness.

Sixteen players are seeded in the men's singles and both British players will be among the leading 16 in the rankings because Spaniard Alberto Berasategui has not made an entry for Wimbledon.

The Wimbledon committee reserve the right not to go straight down the rankings when they seed the players. So Henman would almost certainly have been seeded even if he had not been among the top 16 entries because of his achievement of reaching the quarter-finals for the past two years.

Rusedski, a semi-finalist at the Stella Artois last year, lost 57 ranking points at the Queen's Club tournament last week but still has 3,037 — 67 ahead of nearest rival, Spaniard Carlos Moya (2,970).

Henman has 1,854 points which enabled him to pass Sweden's Thomas Enqvist, who is now just three points behind the Oxford player.

But both Rusedski and Henman will lose points this week because neither is playing in the Nottingham Open — Rusedski because of his injury, Henman by choice.

Last year Rusedski won the tournament and Henman was a semi-finalist.

Sam Smith, the 26-year-old British women's number one from Essex, has jumped from 128 to 112 in the latest WTA rankings following her two victories in the DFS Classic at Birmingham last week.

Smith first beat Australian Rachel McQuillan, ranked 63, 6-2 7-5 and then defeated Sarah Pitkowski of France, ranked 47, 7-6 (7-3) 6-3.

Karen Cross, the British number two from Exeter, remains at 138 while Lorna Woodroffe of Surrey has moved up from 154 to 148. Julie Pullin of Sussex is 175 and Jo Ward of Middlesex is 195.

## RASHID FIRES A CUP SALVO

MARCHINGTON strolled into the semi finals of the Breweries Cup as they brushed aside the challenge of LULLINGTON PARK by 198 runs.

The Derbyshire County League team's dream of their first-ever appearance in the final was wrecked as Pakistan Test star Rashid Latif plundered a savage 140 to help Marchington to an impregnable 297-8.

Yet it might have been so different if a sharp return chance offered by Latif when he had scored only one had not eluded the upstretched arm of Steve Docker.

Harry Khan and Wasim Rouff gave the visitors a solid start with a brisk opening stand of 76, broken by Park seamer Docker when he had Rouff smartly caught by Howard Dytham.

After his let off, Latif got into his routine with an innings of aggression and style to decisively swing the game Marchington's way.

Facing 114 balls, he powered a string of 19 boundaries — three of them big sixes — before falling to Mudd's catch from spinner Garth Littlejohn.

Park's batsmen were soon the rack early on. Littlejohn, after driving two boundaries, nudged the ball to the waiting hands of Aslam Javed, and though Tony Mudd and Dytham put together a strong 46 run second run stand for the home side, the writing was soon on the wall and Ken Maxwell and Khan both claimed three wickets

as the home team slumped to 99 all out.

● DRAYCOTT & HANBURY squeezed through by eight runs in a tense finish at HAMMERWICH.

Batting first, the visitors made full use of the 59 overs available to them to post 214-8.

Despite the damp and gloom, both teams produced attractive cricket as the batsmen went for their shots.

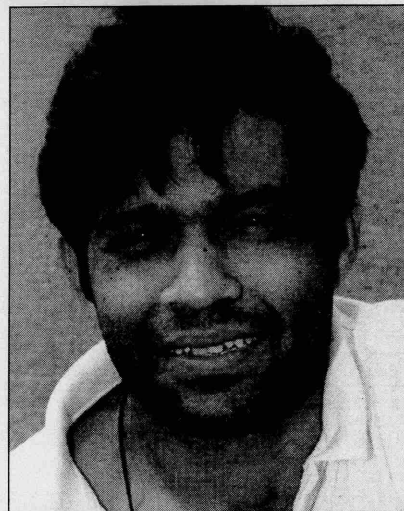
Paul Green led the way for Ind Coope with an aggressive 72, sharing good partnerships with Ray McGuinness and Steve
