GREG Rusedski has held on to his number four world ranking despite bowing out of the Stella Artois tournament ast week with an injured inkle while Tim Henman has moved up one place from 18 to 17.

This means that both British players will be among the Wimbledon seeds, although there is considerable doubt about sedski's fitness.

Sixteen players are seeded in the men's singles and both British players will be among the leading 16 in the rankings be cause Spaniard Alberto Berasategui has not made an entry for Wimbledon.

The Wimbledon committee reserve the right not to go straight down the rankings when they seed the players. So Henman would almost certainly have been seeded even if he had not been among the top 16 entries because of his achievement of reaching the quarter-finals for the past two years.

Rusedski, a semi-finalist at the Stella Artois last year, lost 57 ranking points at the Queen's Club tournament last week but still has 3,037 — 67 ahead of nearest rival, Spaniard Carlos Moya (2,970).

Henman has 1,854 oints which enabled him to pass Sweden's Thomas Enqvist, who is now just three points behind the Oxford player.

But both Rusedski and Henman will lose points this week because neither is playing in the Nottingham Open — Rusedski because of his injury, Henman by

Last year Rusedski won the tournament and Henman was a semi-finalist.

Sam Smith, the 26-year-old British women's year-old British women's number one from Essex, has jumped from 128 to 112 in the latest WTA rankings following her two victories in the DFS Classic at Birmingham last week.

Smith first beat Australian Rachel McQuil-lan, ranked 63, 6-2 7-5 and then defeated Sarah Pitkowski of France, ranked 47, 7-6 (7-3) 6-3.

Karen Cross, the Brit-ish number two from Exeter, remains at 138 while Lorna Woodroffe of Surrey has moved up from 154 to 148. Julie Pullin of Sussex is 175 and Jo Ward of Middle-sex is 195.
